

About me

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Hey, Lucians!

As a member of Lucy's disabled student body, I am passionate about advocating for the diverse needs of students with disabilities.

Disability can take many forms, and as such it is pertinent that we are not treated like a monolith. As Disability Officer I would ensure that no matter the disability, our MCR will see and serve the *person*, not their diagnosis.

Previous Disability and Support Roles

Whilst working at Irwin Mitchell solicitors, I founded and chaired Irwin Mitchell's IMAble Neurodivergency Support Group, whom I was later invited to represent at the Microsoft Legal Accessibility Roundtable held at their London headquarters.

During my undergraduate studies I acted as the Director of Publicity and Lead Mentor for the buddy scheme, a student led service within our Student's Union.

I also ran a 'showbiz club' at my local Seashell Trust for children and young people with profound and complex special educational needs.

Empowerment and Support

If elected, I will operate an 'open door' policy. This will ensure that I am accessible to all students, willing and ready to listen to your thoughts and suggestions concerning all things disability. As the scope of 'disability' is so vast, with individuals having very unique and specific needs, I believe a culture of openness with complete transparency is fundamentally important. I do not pretend to know everything about *all* disabilities, and certainly not about the specific experiences of every single disabled student here at Lucy! As such, I aim to provide a friendly listening ear so that I may raise your *specific* concerns and take action to make your personal circumstances better.

Advocacy and Representation

To ensure that I am the best advocate for disabled Lucians that I can be, I will implement a **feedback mechanism** for students to report **accessibility issues**, **discrimination**, **or concerns** related to disability support services to me directly. This will **reduce the burden** placed on disabled students to struggle and fight for the support or help that they need, and empower me to use my position as Disability Officer to ease this. Although there are many important elements to this role, I believe the **ability to deliver positive outcomes** for disabled students is the most salient. Pretty words of solidarity and pledges of raised awareness are wonderful, but without any **material changes** to the **disabled student experience**, they're pretty meaningless. Disabled students deserve someone who **truly cares** stood in their corner, and I hope to be that person for you.

Celebration and Community

Community and friendship can offer so much, and it's for this reason my third pledge is focused on creating space for this to **flourish**. If elected I pledge to foster a supportive community for **disabled students and their allies** at Lucy. I'd love to hold events and celebrations that **embrace our diverse abilities**, **reduce stigma**, and create an **inclusive**, **empathetic environment**. By building this community, we can encourage **open and empathetic dialogue** about disabilities, where every student has a platform to share their experiences, challenges, and achievements. Together, we stand for **accessibility, allyship**, and **awareness**, working to ensure every member of our MCR feels **valued and supported**.
